
I studied management first, and I've also been a manager in Ukraine. After eight years of working I decided to change my career because I wanted to try something new.







Humber's largest campus is situated on 250 acres of green space at Finch Avenue and Highway 27, right on the banks of the Humber River. The campus is easily accessible from Brampton, Mississauga, Toronto and York Region, and is a public transit ride away from downtown Toronto.


Energetic and dynamic, the North Campus is home to the Learning Resource Commons, an open, bright six-storey facility that houses most of the campus's student services, as well as a range of study, meeting and socializing areas. The North Campus residence has space for 1,000 students and overlooks the Humber Arboretum, with gardens, parkland and hiking trails – and the odd deer sighting!

I was debating between the arts program at Humber and a few other schools. I thought it would be good to work on my portfolio and get a solid base in general arts. That's how I ended up here.

I grew up on a reservation, Attawapiskat First Nation, on and off until I was 10 or 11. Then I spent my teenage years in Sutton on Lake Simcoe. Sutton is a small town and I wanted so much more. Humber and living in Toronto has opened up new experiences for me.

The professors are really good at providing guidance. A lot of them are practicing artists; they have experience in galleries and the workforce.

The art gallery space in my program is pretty cool. It used to be a hair salon, so it's huge. It's great for making art and being creative. There's a great warmth with everyone at Humber – it's like a family.

LAKESHORE CAMPUS

Featuring classrooms and labs in 10 restored heritage buildings, the Lakeshore Campus is also home to several new and recently restored spaces, including: the Centre for Entrepreneurship, a place for students who want to launch their own businesses or learn new skills; the Student Welcome and Resource Centre, which houses many of the campus's student services, and a Fitness Centre. The Lakeshore Commons provides four floors of classrooms, meeting, study and socializing spaces, and an art gallery. Four hundred students call the Lakeshore Student Residence home.






I came to Canada as an international student and studied economics at Trent University. After working at a financial company for a few years, I realized it wasn't for me, and that my true passion is cooking.

Advanced diplomas take six semesters to complete and usually incorporate a work placement. Diplomas take at least four semesters, while certificates are usually less than four semesters.





There are ensemble rooms available for students to book in the evenings, and every student has the opportunity to arrange and perform their own concert in the auditorium.

DIPLOMA TO DEGREE TRANSFER STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Students who have achieved a program GPA of 80 per cent or better will be awarded a one-time scholarship of \$2,500. 
It is the only four-year paralegal degree program to receive accreditation from the Law Society of Ontario.

My time in the Police Foundations program put into perspective for me what you have to expect going into this career. It helps having teachers that have been and are still police officers.


I haven't seen a simulation lab like Humber's anywhere else. The situations and graphics are so life-like. I did a driving simulation and a use-of-force simulation.
